**TRANSPORTING MEDICAL AID IN THE  
MOST EFFICIENT WAY**

Since summer 2019, we have been using 20ft shipping containers to send health care goods to our rural health partners in Africa. This method enables us to send large amounts to multiple health units at one time. Gift in wills can ensure projects like this can continue in the future.



**FINDING NEW WAYS TO SUPPORT OUR  
PARTNERS IN AFRICA**

When we visited Malawi in 2019, we witnessed the challenges our partners are facing. The country has just 350 clinical doctors to treat a population of 18 million. Even the largest hospitals are woefully lacking the basic equipment needed to treat the most serious cases so, we now ensure our containers are filled with medical devices as well as health care goods. This is just one example of how, by visiting the countries that we support, we improve our understanding of exactly where our help is needed. We then act quickly to deliver medical aid directly.

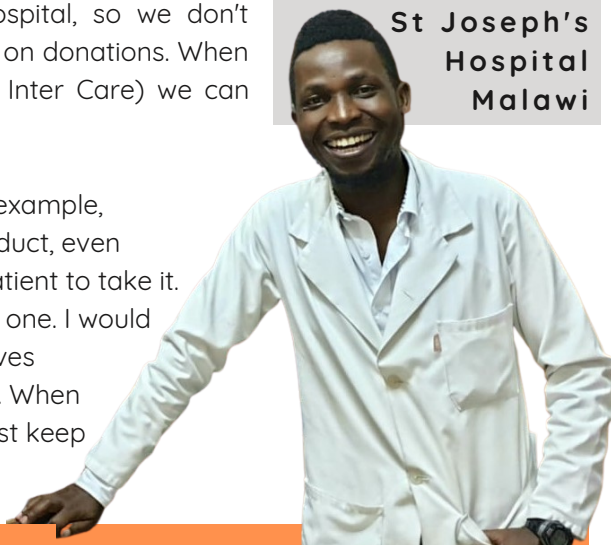
## Jezman explains the challenges around funds

St Joseph's Hospital is a mission hospital, so we don't generate a lot of funds, so we depend on donations. When we receive products like these (from Inter Care) we can give them to patients for free.

## How Inter Care helps us...

The donated medicines help a lot. For example, this amoxicillin, that is a very good product, even the packaging, makes it easier for a patient to take it. It is expensive to get a product like this one. I would like to say thank you for the gifts. It gives us the opportunity to save lives as well. Dr Turay visited Inter Care on 25th July 2019. We showed him how we run our warehouse. Then we asked how we could support him in his management of Holy Spirit Hospital.

### How we have supported Holy Spirit Hospital...

Holy Spirit Hospital was the first of Inter Care's partners to receive a 20ft container of medical supplies. The container was sent just before Dr Turay's visit and held a whopping £102,505 of surplus medical aid including large items of equipment such as wheelchairs, and supplies such as Personal Protective Equipment and uniforms.

## An earthquake hits Tanzania...

Just three miles from the Ugandan border, a small village called Bukwali was shaken to the ground. Many people fought for their lives, many more got burnt from the spreading flames.

## Inter Care step in...

The doctors at Bukwali's Dispensary were in desperate need of medical aid to treat the people's injuries and severe burns.



## Inter Care responded by sending specialist "burns dressings" and pain relief medicines.

## What happened to Zola?

During all of this, Zola, a single mother of small children, was asleep in her mud hut. A fire broke out! Zola quickly got her children out but, she got severely burnt all over her body.

## What did Zola do?

In her vulnerable condition Zola walked the the Dispensary. She was in need of urgent help and the doctor feared she would not survive. However he was able to treat Zola with Inter Care's specialist burns dressings. Dr Burko was so grateful for Inter Care's help.
