### Mary's Story - May 2023



Mary is 9 months old and is a Maasai daughter. The family live 7km away from ACDK dispensary. Whilst playing with her sister on the dirt tracks, Mary sustained an injury. Her mother noticed tearing and redness in her left eye.

After 10 days of using home remedies, May's mother took her to ACDK for treatment. The staff were able to provide Mary with eye drops and other ointments to relieve the infection.

The staff said to us, "*The Inter Care donated medical aid is received with great gratitude by Doctors, Nurses and the patients who are now receiving the services. Since this is our first consignment, we are reviewing our medical supplies and see how much on our side we can subsidize the costs to alleviate patients burden of what was formally known as cost sharing*".

Mustafa's Story – December 2023



Mustafa is 98 years old. He has been blind for 3 years. He could not go to the toilet without support. Mustafa was confused and sad. His family took him to ACDK dispensary to get assessed as they were concerned.

After examination, he was diagnosed with mature cataract in both eyes. He had an operation on his eyes and the results were very good. He was given eye drops to take home and the staff requested to see him again in two weeks.

When Mustafa returned to ACDK dispensary in two weeks, he “spread his hands to give the nurse a hug”! He expressed his gratitude and said, “God is wonderful, let him be praised”.

Inter Care were able to help with his diagnosis by providing Ophthalmic Equipment to the eye clinic.
